Pine Rivers Catchment Association (PRCA) in partnership with Council, initiated the South Pine River Project in 2001 with the aim of restoring the critically endangered riparian vegetation, which was heavily infested with weeds. Monthly surveys by the *Birders of the South Pine River* began in 2011 to investigate river bank restoration and biodiversity.

Bird surveys are conducted every second Wednesday of every month beginning at 7.00 in summer and 7.30 in winter. We meet in the Kumbartcho Sanctuary Carpark. All are welcome to this free activity conducted by experienced bird watchers, most of whom are members of Birds Queensland. Please register before attending, with the Pine Rivers Catchment Office.

The *Birders of the South Pine River* produced a 70 page, full colour, A5 sized booklet showcasing most of the birds seen over the seven years of birding along the banks of the South Pine River. This is available for purchase for \$10/copy from the Pine Rivers Catchment Office.
